As chairman of the Orange County Gang Reduction and Intervention Partnership, Baugh has worked with police to prevent crime and give kids hope for the future. In Congress, Baugh will cut taxes and stand up to the socialists in Congress who are trying to make it easier for criminals to get out of jail.
